VI. Reports

- > Mayor's Report
 - Requested City Council to support: Follow-up on actions necessary for
 - traffic Calming measures, Ordinance on Traffic regulation, Sensys Gatsco
 - has per city council request, provided success metrics relative to other jurisdictions over a month ago.
 - Requested a formal decision on the contractor's offer by letter to Mayor's Office.
 - Requested that a lobbyist be secured
 - Interviewed project manager candidates for the ARPA Funds reporting.
 - Conducted Swearing in ceremony for two new Officers for the City of Glenarden Police Department
 - Mayor Cross inquired about the status of the Project Manager for the American Rescue Plan Act project; she doesn't know if Council also interviews the candidates
 - O Mayor Cross stated that Council is holding up the process as there is a critical need for funds to be made available and that no status has been provided by the City Manager
 - o Mayor Cross also stated that an email had been sent to Council and thought that would result in a Resolution to come forth for the PM position
 - CM Herring, Vice President Ferguson and CW Jones concurred that the responsibility of Mayor Cross to be kept abreast of the status of the PM position, as Mayor Cross also supervises the City Manager;
 - O Vice President Ferguson reiterated that an email doesn't constitute the writing of a Resolution
 - o CW Fareed and Vice President Ferguson agreed that the City Manager has been extremely helpful and has provided good service to the citizens.
 - O CW Guillaume discussed the Good Samaritan Hardship legislation that is forthcoming and strongly rejected the impression that Council is at fault.

> City Manager's Report

- Mrs. Barbour reported that two candidates for the PM position had been interviewed. A decision was made and she and Mrs. Shoultz are waiting for the candidate to go through the security clearance process.
- Infrastructure Request from Citizens
 - The request was about the run-off on Hamlin. The contractor has given a quote of \$17,940 to correct the problems
 - CM Herring added that Council/City Manager that there is grant money available to address these issue
- ➤ Homestead Tax Credit must be responded to ASAP
 - o CM Herring made note of the letter received from the NAACP. The letter had inaccurate information; no research or due diligence was done prior to sending the letter
 - O CW Guillaume equated the tactics as "Trump like" the letter wasn't factually based and had a false narrative.
 - W Fareed stated the actions are nefarious and reiterated that the Charter Review Process has just begun. On Thursday, citizens will have an opportunity to provide feedback on the discussion about the form of government
 - She also talked about the various sections in the Charter that are conflicting
 - O She also noted about a ten-year schedule to review of the Charter has been suggested
- Mrs. Barbour also reported that there have been three quotes given for removal of three trees in the MLK Park.

- Mr. McKenzie is against the commercial parking legislation; request the Council to find a common ground for additional discussions
